Rosemary Bernardi, 10 Halifax Court, inquired as to the purpose of Consent Agenda Resolution No. 249-2017. Township Manager Tom Czerniecki responded that there have been several requests from the residents of Legacy Oaks to connect the sidewalk from the development to Sharp Road. The contract, as awarded by the aforementioned resolution, allows for a study to measure the environmental impact of constructing said sidewalk. Discussion ensued with Councilman D'Andrea.

Ken Mills, 109 Meadow Lane, commended Mr. D'Andrea on his efforts to repair certain sidewalks in the Township.

Mayor Brown opened public hearing on the above ordinance.

Rosemary Bernardi, 10 Halifax Court, expressed her concern about the development of apartments on Main Street and how they may negatively impact downtown walkability. Moreover, Ms. Bernardi also voiced concern for the preservation of the historic buildings in the area during the course of redevelopment. Discussion ensued with Township Manager Tom Czerniecki and Deputy Director of Community Development, Leah Furey, on the benefits of constructing the apartments at that location.

Ken Mills, 109 Meadow Lane, reflected Ms. Bernardi's comments pertaining to the existing buildings on Main Street. Township Manager Tom Czerniecki explained that the above ordinance is simply a plan, and does not state any specific intentions to remove those properties or exert eminent domain. Mr. Mills thanked Mr. Czerniecki for clarification.

Paul Vonzech, 27 Inverness Circle, discussed the possibility of utilizing a different approach to the redevelopment on Main Street. Mayor Brown and Township Manager Tom Czerniecki explained that all redevelopment methods have been studied prior to the recommendation as made in Ordinance No. 19-7-2017. Additionally, Mayor Brown noted that the plan for the redevelopment on Main Street is also related to the vision study for the future of the Township completed in 2008-2009, which was heavily influenced by the input of residents.

There being no further comments, Mayor Brown closed public hearing on Ordinance No. 19-7-2017.

Mayor Brown opened public hearing on the above ordinance.

Rosemary Bernardi, 10 Halifax Court, questioned the specifics of the tax abatement agreement as related to the residential construction at the site. Township Manager Tom Czerniecki explained that the above ordinance provides a tax abatement agreement to only the residential portion of the project, and that a separate agreement will be made in the future for the commercial portion. He also noted that the existing commercial properties will not receive a tax abatement, and that that area will be subject to standard taxation.

Ms. Bernardi then discussed her dissatisfaction with the allocation of monies generated from the tax abatement and expressed her concern that certain Township entities will not benefit from the same. Mr. Czerniecki responded that said entities will experience a much greater benefit in the long-run from the tax abatement than without, as the project will have the ability to be completed at a higher quality, which in turn will bring in more revenue.

Ken Mills, 109 Meadow Lane, stated his concern that the School District will not see immediate revenue during the course of the tax abatement. Mayor Brown reiterated the response given to Ms. Bernardi on the same issue.

There being no further comments, Mayor Brown closed public hearing on Ordinance No. 20-7-2017.
